

**ORDINANCE NO. 98-1**  
**AN ORDINANCE REGULATING OPEN BURNING**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF DUNLAP, IN THE COUNTY OF PEORIA, AND STATE OF ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Except as otherwise provided in this Ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person ~~to set fire to, or cause or permit to be burned,~~ in any yard, lot, street or alley, any rubbish, any garbage, ~~paper, tires,~~ rubbers, oils, plastics, chemicals, flammables or hazardous materials, or to burn any ~~materials~~ for the purpose of waste disposal.

Section 2. Leaf burning and bonfire/recreational fires shall be allowed only as provided for in this Ordinance.

Section 3. The location for any leaf burning or bonfire/recreational fire shall be not less than fifty feet (50) from any structure and provision shall be made to prevent the fire from spreading to within fifty (50) feet of any structure. No burning shall occur on any street.

Section 4. Any leaf burning or bonfire/recreational fire shall be constantly attended by a responsible adult until the fire is completely extinguished.

Section 5. Leaf burning fires shall be allowed only between the hours of sunrise and sunset.

Section 6. Fire extinguishing equipment (including but not limited to garden hoses, buckets of waters, rakes, and shovels) shall be available for immediate use at the location of all leaf burning fires and bonfire/recreational fires.

Section 7. A bonfire/recreational fire shall be no more than five feet by five feet (5' X 5') in dimension. Fuel for a bonfire/recreational fire shall consist only of seasoned dry firewood to be ignited with a small quantity of paper. The fire shall not be used for waste disposal purposes and the fuel shall be chosen to minimize the generation of air contaminants.

Section 8. Every person convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense, plus attorneys' fees and court costs.


Section 9. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.


